In Lawrence, Kansas, Brandon Reese, owner of Reese's Lawn Care, has been quietly building more than beautiful yards—he's been cultivating opportunity. Through his partnership with Artists Helping the Homeless (AHH), Brandon has opened doors to employment for several men rebuilding their lives. His willingness to offer steady work and mentorship to those re-entering the community embodies the AHH belief that everyone deserves a fair chance to grow.

One of those given that chance is Arthur "Artie" Elmer, who began working with Reese's Lawn Care while staying in AHH's transitional housing program. Over time, Artie became not just a reliable employee but a trusted right hand. His consistency and hard work became a source of pride for both AHH and Brandon, showing what can happen when compassion meets opportunity.

When Brandon was hospitalized with severe kidney stones and unable to work, Artie stepped up—taking on every responsibility from opening the shop to leading crews on job sites. Because of Artie's dedication, the company never missed a beat. "Everyone needs someone to believe in them," Brandon said. "Sometimes all they need is a chance." Their story is living proof that when compassion guides opportunity, communities grow stronger together.
